g Some people mistake me for my cousin the frog. I dig holes backward with my hind feet. I walk, not hop, around the small ravine.

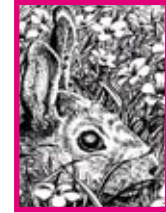


h Would you ever suspect I can grow big wings? For now I walk near the bridge on the Woodland Trail.
